Our Core Initiatives

Our mission is to empower vulnerable children to reach their full potential, and our vision is a family for every child in our lifetime.

Our Initiatives:

Miracle Foundation India has two primary ways we achieve our vision:

1) We re-integrate children with families

Children do not belong in childcare instituitions, they belong in families. As we lead the transition of children away from institutions, our job is to make sure this work is done in a safe, stable, permanent and scalable way.

2) We prevent children from entering the childcare instituitions

Every day around the world, social workers, caregivers and government officials make decisions that impact millions of vulnerable children. We provide highly specialized training and educational resources for these "boots on the ground" workers in the childcare ecosystem, allowing them to identify and support at-risk children long before separation is even an option.



We re-integrate children with families

All children are entitled to an education, nutrition, health and protection. Over the past twenty years, we have developed our proprietary Thrive Scale[™] methodology, based on the UN Rights of the Child, to measure and improve life for more than 20,000 children in nearly 300 childcare instituitions.

Today, our focus is helping these same children return to families. And so we've adapted our Thrive Scale[™] to measure and activate a child's rights after they return home.

Across India, the Covid crisis sent 64% of children in institutional care home to their families. Miracle's rapid response provided much needed case management and family support to ensure children were safe at home and stayed at home.

Now, our proven processes are being shared with other countries, helping to bring more and more children family. Whether through training sessions with UNICEF in India or video resources on our website, we welcome all partners who can help us create a family for every child in our lifetime.



We prevent children from entering the childcare instituitions

Every day around the world, social workers, caregivers, and government officials make decisions that impact millions of vulnerable children. That's why we work along with state departments and other partners to provide highly specialized training and educational resources for these "boots on the ground" workers in the childcare ecosystem.

Miracle Foundation India has trained 2,400+ government officials and caregivers and activated community and youth led initiatives. All of this outreach works to identify and support at-risk children and vulnerable families long before formal interventions become a necessity. Our goal is to end the need for institutional care by stopping the flow of children before they enter the childcare instituitions.



THRIVE SCALE METHODOLOGY



This revolutionary tool helps take the guesswork out of child re-integration.

Our Thrive Scale[™] is how we measure, track and improve wellness areas during home assessments, both for vulnerable children returning to families and for at-risk families who need support before child separation is necessary. This versatile tool is infinitely scalable, allowing us to train partners and share with case managers as we seek a family for every child in our lifetime.

Everyone knows children belong in families. But how do you bring them home safely? The Thrive Scale[™] is the way.











Youth Take the Lead

Miracle Foundation believes in empowering young people, and this year, we launched many initiatives that put the ideas and energy of the world's youth at the forefront of our work.

Around the world, our Youth For Social Impact project offered \$4000 grants and training to qualified, motivated participants. Like a series of mini pilot programs, this initiative helped develop Sinet's orphan community podcast in Cambodia, Grace's Life Skills Training program in Kenya, Adonyo's vocational training for girls in Uganda and so much more.
