Life Skills Education Modules Situation Based Matrix WIRACLE



Concept	Scenarios/Situation	LSE areas of focus
Making New Friends	A child starts at a new school and feels shy about approaching classmates.	Social skills, communication, emotional intelligence.
Following Instructions	A child is asked to help a parent with chores	Listening, teamwork.
Expressing Emotions	feeling upset after losing a favorite toy/ or not getting something that they are wishing for	Emotional awareness, communication.
Making Choices	A child must choose between joining a sports team or a music class.	Decision-making, evaluating options.
Conflict Resolution	Two children argue over a game during playtime.	Problem-solving, negotiation, empathy.
Time Management	child has homework to complete but also wants to play outside.	Prioritization, planning.
Handling Peer Pressure	A teenager is pressured by friends to skip school.	Assertiveness, critical thinking, self-awareness.
Setting Goals	student wants to improve their grades but is unsure how to start.	Goal-setting, self-management.
Coping with Stress	A teenager feels overwhelmed with schoolwork and extracurricular activities.	Stress management, emotional regulation.
Preparing for Job Interviews	young adult is applying for their first job and needs to prepare for an interview.	Communication skills, self-presentation
Financial Literacy	A teenager receives their first allowance or paycheck and needs to budget it wisely.	Money management, planning.
Navigating Relationships	young adult is experiencing challenges in a romantic relationship.	Communication, empathy, conflict resolution.
Living Independently	young adult moves out for the first time and must manage household responsibilities	Self-management, problem-solving, independence
Career Planning	college student is unsure about their career path after graduation.	Decision-making, goal-setting, networking.
Coping with Life Changes	young adult faces the stress of transitioning from college to the workforce.	Resilience, adaptability, emotional intelligence.
